School day: settling in

Our school hours

- Morning session 8.55am - 12.00 noon.
- Afternoon session 12.55pm - 3.30pm.

Breakfast club

We offer pre- and after-school childcare provision at Kelsey Primary School. The morning sessions run from 7.30 to 8.45 am. (School staff will take over supervision at 8.45). The afternoon / evening sessions run from 3.30 until 6.00 pm. The provision is run by Kelsey Primary School. All the team have an enhanced DBS, first aid training and food hygiene training.

Uniform

Our school uniform is designed to be practical but comfortable and to give the children a sense of school identity. It consists of burgundy sweatshirts with gold embroidered school logo, white short sleeved polo shirts, grey or black skirts or trousers, white, black or grey socks or tights. During the summer term, girls may wear burgundy/white striped or checked dresses.

Food in school

Our delicious food is provided by Kingswood Education Catering. Every day there is a choice of hot meals, including a vegetarian option.

Clubs

We have a very generous offer of after school clubs for all children to access free of charge.

Extra-curricular clubs are offered to all year groups with no compulsory charge. We believe that these clubs play an important role in their enjoyment of school life and help to build pupils' self-esteem and confidence. These clubs are organised around pupil interests and requests to ensure maximum engagement. Clubs on offer throughout the year include:

Dance, football, tennis, basketball, netball, drama, cooking, running, gardening, boccia, dodgeball, and STEM (science and technology)



Creative curriculum: a firm foundation for learning

Our Curriculum is designed to:

- Challenge and excite our children.
- Provide an atmosphere in which all children grow to love the feeling that learning can bring – so empowering them to become 'life-long learners.'
- Teach our children about society and citizenship.
- Link with local, regional, national and international communities.
- Recognise that failure is a form of learning.

Our school has used local knowledge and reports to carefully consider what our children need to learn in relation to the context that they are growing up in. The following aspects run as key drivers through our curriculum to ensure our specific pupil needs are met:

Globally aware: With good knowledge about global issues, our pupils will realise the importance of taking good care of our planet. We want them to have the confidence to travel and explore as they grow older, which will open up new opportunities for their futures.

Culturally aware: As our school and community is predominantly white British our children need to understand how Britain and other parts of the world are multi-cultural and why this should be celebrated.

Self-aware: Understanding more about themselves both physically and emotionally will allow our pupils to reflect and continuously improve.

Key Stage Ready and Ambitious: We want children to be completely ready for the next stage in their education both spiritually and academically.



The Foundation Stage (Pre-School and Reception)

Foundation Stage learning is based on six areas:

- Communication and literacy.
- Mathematical development.
- Creative development.
- Physical development.
- Knowledge and understanding of the world.
- Personal, social and emotional development.

Learning is fun and play is an integral part of the process. We are very lucky to have a large classroom and outdoor area which are organised to ensure that they support different types of learning such as messy play, role play, construction and creative activities. We also have dedicated reading and maths areas.

Pre-school nursery

Our pre-school nursery provides a happy, safe and stimulating learning environment for children from the age of 3. It is based in our Early Years classroom along with our reception children.



Enriched curriculum

Inspiring educational visits

Our pupils visit top UK destinations as part of their curriculum enrichment. All pupils have opportunities to visit the most exciting local and national venues which are interlinked with our curriculum. Such examples include London, The National Space Centre, The Deep and Religious places of worship. Additionally, residential visits are offered in Years 4 and 6, giving children the chance to explore and develop important outdoor and adventurous skills!

Specialist Subjects Delivered by Specialist Teachers

PE, music and Spanish are all delivered by specialist teachers from the our local secondary school partner. This means that pupils get the expertise that they deserve. In addition, pupils visit the local secondary school each term to compete against other schools in the sports that they have recently been taught. These experiences also help them to prepare for secondary school life.

All children have the opportunity to learn how to play instruments like the ukulele in music lessons. Additionally, parents can request tuition for children to be taught how to play instruments such as the piano, violin and guitar!

Outstanding outcomes for pupils

Our Year 6 SATS results are consistently well above local and national averages.



Admissions and getting involved

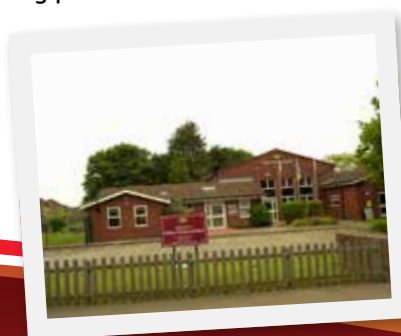


Admissions

You must apply through your home local authority even if the schools you name on your application are not in Lincolnshire. You can apply online at www.lincolnshire.gov.uk/schooladmissions, by email to request a paper form schooladmissions@lincolnshire.gov.uk, or by phone (01522 782030). If you apply online and enter a valid email address, you will receive an email confirming your preferences. If you apply by phone and provide a valid email address, you will receive confirmation of your application by email. If you cannot provide a valid email address, they will send you a confirmation letter by post for you to verify and return.

Transfer from nursery to school

This will not happen automatically, and you will need to apply for a place in reception and there is no guarantee your child will be offered a place at the school. Attendance at pre-reception, nursery or attached playgroup is not taken into account when allocating places.

Kelsey Parents and Teachers Association (PTA) is a charitable group which supports the school and make a positive difference by organising fund raising events, volunteering their time and connecting parents socially. The PTA are mainly made up of parents and staff of the school and meet about six times a year.
